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RESOLUTION NO. 2022-13

2022 FIVE COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL NATURAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN ADOPTION

- WHEREAS**, the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah (“Tribe”) is a federally recognized Indian tribe under 25 U.S.C. § 761, et seq., organized under the Tribe’s Constitution, as ratified by the Tribe on June 11, 1991, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on July 15, 1991, and amended by the Tribe on August 12, 1997, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on September 30, 1997, pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984); and
- WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article IV and Article V of the Constitution of the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, the Tribal Council is the official governing body of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, the Tribal Council is vested with all executive and legislative powers of the Tribe, including the power to make and implement laws; and
- WHEREAS**, pursuant to its inherent sovereignty as an Indian Tribe and Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribe recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within our tribal lands, reservation lands, and surrounding communities; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribe has worked and collaborated with the Five County Association of Governments in preparing a multi-hazard mitigation plan in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and the requirements in Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations Section 201.7; and
- WHEREAS**, the Plan specifically addresses hazard mitigation strategies and plan maintenance procedures for the Tribe and its five constituent Bands; and
- WHEREAS**, the Plan recommends several hazard mitigation actions and projects that will provide mitigation for specific natural hazards that impact the Tribe and its constituent Bands, with the effect of protecting people and property from loss associated with those hazards; and
- WHEREAS**, the adoption of this plan will make the Tribe eligible for funding to alleviate the impacts of future hazards on the Reservation; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah Tribal Council that:

1. The Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Tribe.
2. The respective officials identified in the mitigation strategy of the Plan are hereby directed to pursue implementation of the recommended actions assigned to them.
3. Future revisions and plan maintenance required by 44 CFR 201.7 and FEMA are hereby adopted as a part of this resolution for a period of five (5) years from the date of this resolution.
4. An annual report on the progress of the implementation elements of the Plan shall be presented to the Tribal Council by December 31st of each calendar year.
5. The Tribe will comply with all applicable Federal statutes and regulations in effect with respect to the periods for which it receives grant funding, including 2 CFR Parts 200 and 3002; and will amend our plan whenever necessary to reflect applicable changes in Tribal or federal laws and statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah Tribal Council hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and/or Tribal Administrator to sign and execute any and all documents that are a part thereof, and to sign and execute any contracts, agreements, and amendments in accordance with approved Tribal policies and procedures and applicable regulations, and to carry out the provisions of the Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan.

CERTIFICATION
