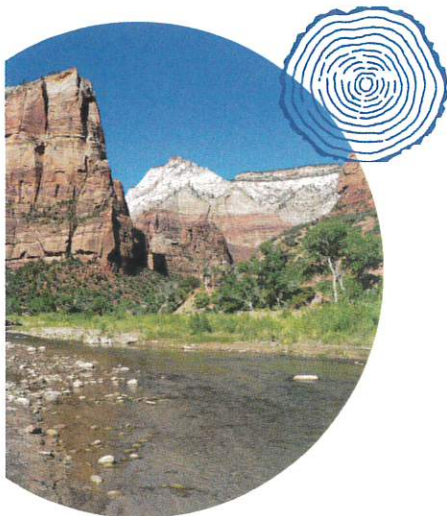




# Zion National Park: Traditional Trades Advancement Program (TTAP)- Indian Youth Service Corps (IYSC)

Zion National Park

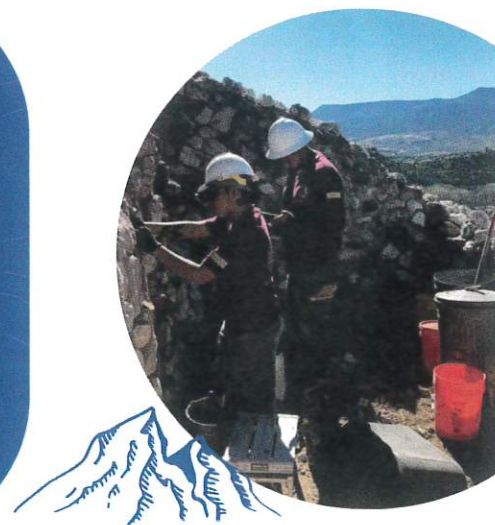
- The IYSC program is designed to engage Indigenous youth in meaningful cultural preservation projects on Federal and Tribal lands
- TTAP provides mentorship in hands-on historic preservation and specialized skills training:
  - Masonry, carpentry, historic trail work, stabilization, restoration, preservation, electrical wiring, and more
- NO Prior experience is needed!
- 5 month (20-week) commitment
- Willingness to work outdoors in conditions that may be physically demanding
- Participants will work in the Zion Group National Parks: Zion National Park, Cedar Breaks National Monument & Pipe Spring National Monument

## Position Requirements:

- Must be between age 18-30 (or up to 35 for veterans, and 21+ if on-the-job driving is required)
- US Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Must be fully vaccinated for Covid-19 or have requested and been granted a medical or religious exemption to vaccination by the time they start their term.
- Check out the position listing using the QR code for full requirements

## Additional Perks:

- Living allowance of \$599/week
- Housing may be provided at no cost if space is available
- ~\$2400 AmeriCorps education award (upon completion of the term)
- Eligible for Public Land Corps (PLC) hiring authority
